## FLAGSTAFF HILL MARITIME VILLAGE



Flagstaff Hill combines Australia's richest collection of shipwreck artefacts, a 19th century replica village and a multi-million dollar sound and light show to create one of Warrnambool's premier attractions.

## LAKE PERTOBE



If you are travelling with anyone under the age of 15, Lake Pertobe needs to be on your "must-visit" list. Named in the 10 best parks in the South Pacific Region by TripAdvisor, Lake Pertobe is 8ha of pure paradise for kids with playgrounds, giant slides, flying foxes, a maze, boat rides and plenty of open space to run around.

## MAKE THE MOST OF THE COAST



Do you like breathtaking coastal views? So do we! Warrnambool's award winning foreshore promenade is a wonderful 5.7km path that stretches from the breakwater along the Lady Bay coastline to the Hopkins River mouth. It also links up with another trail past Middle Island (home to our local penguin colony), rock pools at Pickering Point before finishing at Thunder Point – arguably the best place in Warrnambool to watch the sun set.

## HOT SPRINGS



Slowly make your journey through a myriad of open-air pools, the Deep Blue Hot Springs is an open-air geothermal bathing sanctuary inspired by raw coastal beauty and harnessing the healing powers of the natural geothermal waters. Let your mind wander into a therapeutic state while your body absorbs the health restoring minerals and heat of natural, earth drawn waters.

## TOWER HILL WILDLIFE RESERVE



Nestled inside a dormant volcano, Tower Hill is a haven for wildlife. It is one of the best places in Victoria to see koalas, emus, echidnas, kangaroos and wallabies in their natural habitat. Tuck into a picnic, venture down one of the signposted nature walks or join an interactive tour with a knowledgeable local guide.

## WHALE WATCHING



*June - September*  
The Logans Beach whale viewing platform is one of the best places in Australia to watch majestic Southern Right Whales, who can frolic within 200 metres of the shore.

## WARRNAMBOOL STREET ART



Warrnambool has a thriving street art scene with world class murals and installations. If you're arriving by train, you can't miss the three-storey Ngatanwarr (Welcome) mural by Adnate.
